RVH to expand professional team with new surgeon in 2012

Renfrew Victoria Hospital will welcome a new general surgeon to its professional team in May 2012.

Dr. Susan Krajewski, who grew up in Ottawa and spent her summers at a family cottage on Golden Lake, received her medical degree from the University of Toronto in 2005. In 2008, she graduated from Harvard University with a Master of Public Health degree. She completed her residency as a General Surgeon at the University of British Columbia (UBC) in 2011.

During the course of her educational endeavours, Dr. Krajewski authored peer-reviewed articles, presented at numerous conferences and took on volunteer/leadership roles for various organizations such as the B.C. Section of General Surgery.

Dr. Kajewski will provide a clinic at St. Francis Memorial Hospital in Barry's Bay as part of the partnership agreement with RVH.

She also appreciates that Dr. Miller has created and maintained a comprehensive surgical practice and looks forward to his mentorship in transitioning into her new role at RVH.

Dr. Krajewski recently completed a six-month locum at Mount St. Joseph's Hospital in Vancouver and says, "I am hoping to continue to provide quality cancer care for the people of Renfrew county closer to home," adding, "RVH has a great surgical program in place and I hope to build on that program with the introduction of laparoscopic colon surgery, which has been shown to decrease length of stay in the hospital and get patients back to work faster."

RVH looks forward to offering expanded procedures to Renfrew and the surrounding area. We will be investing up to \$125,000 for the equipment necessary for these new procedures as part of our corporate commitment to the surgical program.

As part of her locum, Dr. Krajewski completed a clinical traineeship in breast cancer surgery from UBC. She notes, "One of my areas of interest is cancer surgery, specifically surgery for breast and colorectal cancer."

On a personal level, Dr. Krajewski speaks three languages—English, French and Spanish—fluently. Her interests outside of work include downhill skiing, camping, hiking, yoga and travel. She has played lacrosse at university and team Ontario levels. She is married to Louis Watson, a registered nurse who works in the operating room and they have a son, Noah, who turned one year old this month.

"I grew up in Ottawa and we are looking forward to raising our family in the Ottawa Valley," says Dr. Krajewski.
